

Exploring the first five books of the Old Testament: the foundation of God's story – the beginning of His redemptive and persistent pursuit of humanity

This course looks at the beginning story of humanity's redemption by a loving God. Our study takes us through the five books attributed to Moses. They were written to help a people emerging from slavery to form a relationship with God and with one another. These books are recognised by three of the great world religions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam) as fundamental to understanding God, His creation, and His purpose and desire for those made in His image.

At the end of the course, it is anticipated that participants can:

- Identify the books that form the Pentateuch and the main plotline of Scripture.
- Describe how God reveals His desire for relationship through the themes and storyline of the Pentateuch.
- Recognise influences of the Pentateuch within the culture and teaching of Jesus and the first century church.
- Apply these biblical teachings to ourselves today.

The course will be delivered over 8 live online Zoom classes on Saturday mornings. Each session includes time for seminar-style discussion, engaging with Scripture, and discussing practical applications. You'll also enjoy the exchange of ideas with and encouragement from fellow believers committed to knowing God better.
